We were delighted to receive this feedback below from Dennis in Horton's HACS4Men service following his recent visit to the Owt for Nowt shop.







He will celebrate his 79th birthday in April, something he is very proud of.



Owt for Nowt shop relocates

Volunteer-run library opens at the Training Centre



Since 2022 Horton Housing's Training Centre (HHTC) has been offering a book borrowing service, in response to requests from students asking if they could take books home either for themselves or their families to help improve their English and compliment their ESOL classes. They found accessing libraries very difficult and intimidating.

From this concept, a previous key worker on the Step Forward programme came up with the idea of HHTC having its own library, and making it as similar to any other public library as possible. Due to the hard work and efforts of the current Step Forward team based at HHTC who wanted to take this idea forward, and their brilliant volunteer team: Benazir, Sabela and Hiam, the library opened to all students early in 2024.

It has been fantastic watching the volunteers planning what needed to be done and when. They have designed the layout, printed and laminated pictures, made signage and marketed the library to other students, all working together as a team to achieve this. They have grown in confidence, developed new skills and friends, whilst having fun and gaining work experience.

Everyone is really proud of what has been achieved, and the benefits the library will bring to all.





We had a small gathering with some of you for Time To Talk Day on Thursday 1 February. Time to Talk Day takes place annually and encourages the nation to have conversations about mental health by inviting people to get together to talk, listen and change lives.

It was a good opportunity for the volunteers who attended to speak about their feelings and share their experiences. We spoke about mental health and how to reduce stress. It was a relaxed atmosphere and everyone felt empowered.



Our latest roles:



All roles below are based in Bradford. Please note that the roles (except for the Donations Sorter Volunteer) require an enhanced DBS Check, of which we will cover the cost.

Administration Assistant:

You will work alongside the Volunteer Services Manager and Volunteer Services Administrator carrying out general administration duties. Tasks will include logging data, printing, photocopying, using Horton's Volunteer database, making telephone calls and sending letters.

Activities Support Volunteer:

You will assist staff with cook and eat sessions, group activities and administration duties at our Bradford-based home from hospital scheme. You will help to improve the overall wellbeing of those we support at the scheme, many of which are affected by illness and disability.

Donations Sorter:

You will help to sort through the donations that we receive and to make sure that they are being passed onto people who need them most. The role also includes using social media accounts to arrange collections and keeping the record of donations up to date on Excel spreadsheets.

Gardeners:

Our Gardeners encourage and support our tenants to spend time outside in an allotment, helping to create a space for relaxation, exercise, gardening and activities. This role is in Shipley. We hope to welcome individuals with a holistic perspective and ideally some community experience, who enjoy working with groups.
