# A vision for hope: my journey into volunteering

As someone who has faced the challenges of alcoholism and Bipolar disorder, I understand firsthand the importance of having a vision for a better future. Just three years ago, I was grappling with these issues, but with the help of Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) tools and medication, I found a path to recovery. My journey into volunteering began with a simple yet powerful vision: to help others help themselves.

After completing my CBT studies with distinction 18 months ago, I felt a strong desire to give back. This vision kept me motivated through my studies and led me to engage with various charities and wellbeing groups. One local charity provided me with peer support training, opening doors to numerous opportunities.

Volunteering allowed me to connect with many people who work with disadvantaged individuals, including those with mental health issues and addiction. I now volunteer for Horton Housing, offering CBT group workshops and one-on-one sessions. We are also in the process of setting up peer support and wellbeing groups for 2025 at Pinder House in Skipton. These workshops delve deeper into CBT tools, helping participants manage anxiety and depression by creating short and medium-term plans.

Volunteering has given me a renewed sense of purpose and the opportunity to grow. It has shown me the incredible impact of helping others and has kept me well. If you're reading this and wondering how to start, remember that it all begins with a vision. Decide what you want to achieve, create a plan, and take the first step by volunteering in a sector that interests you. You'll be amazed at how many people will support you on your journey.



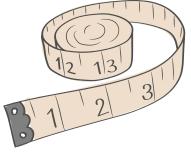
# Shaymaa runs sewing classes at the training centre

We have been running our first ever sewing classes at Horton's Training Centre with the help and support of our brilliant volunteer teacher Shaymaa. The first group of students completed the course in December.

The lessons have proved to be very popular — as well as learning a new and valuable skill, the students have enjoyed helping each other, and sharing lots of ideas.

As the current classes come to a close, some of the garments the students have been working on are being finished, including these beautiful dresses.











Below are some of the comments and feedback we have received from the students.

"I have really enjoyed the classes and have liked wearing the dress I made".

"I have learnt sewing, scissor work, and sewing clothes. I want to learn more, and find a job for myself in this profession. I would like more classes and courses, and to say thank you to Horton Housing."

"I have learnt a lot from the sewing lessons, such as measuring, cutting and sewing on a machine. I wish the course was longer so that we could sew and experiment more."

Shaymaa also said she really enjoyed running the classes and helping the students to learn all about how to sew a garment. Shaymaa attended Horton Housing Training Centre as a student to learn English some years ago, and wanted to give something back. We are hopeful we can run some more sewing classes this year.

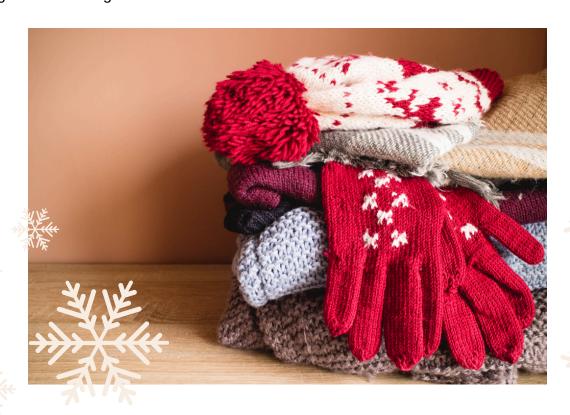
All donations will be collected, sorted and handed out to our services by our amazing team of volunteers.

The volunteer and donations service organised a Halloween / Macmillan coffee morning to raise money for cancer awareness.

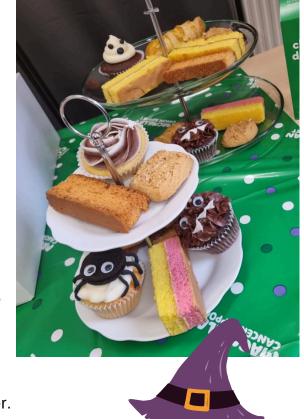

One of our volunteers Shaymaa Alasaad won the hamper.

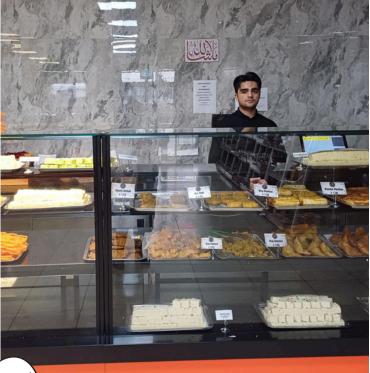
We managed to raise £150! and some staff also donated online.

Registration is open if you or somebody you know would like to be a volunteer.

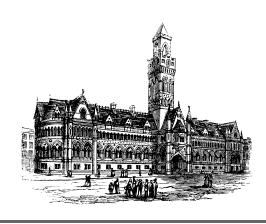

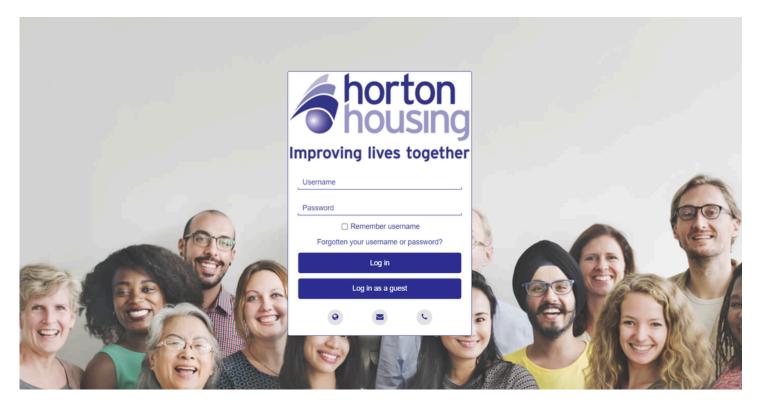
# **50 years of Calderdale**

Please note that the roles require an enhanced DBS Check, of which we will cover the cost.

# **Roles in Bradford**

# **Activities Support**

You will assist with the activity support group at our male-only accommodation service. You will engage with group activities including arts and crafts, coffee mornings, community trips, and much more. The role will require you to attend once-a-week.

# Female Befriender

The Befriender role involves giving support and companionship to people who are socially isolated or experiencing mental health challenges. Befrienders are matched with people in our scheme based on your interests and experiences. You will arrange to meet up with the person you are matched with once-a-week. This may include trips to the park, cinema or telephone conversations. As a Befriender you will need to be a good listener and communicator, friendly, approachable, empathetic, and non-judgemental.

Please note that due to the nature of this service, this is a female-only role.

# **Activities Support**

You will assist staff at our Housing and Community Support (HACS) 4 All based in Keighley with organising activities and taking part in weekly support sessions at the scheme. This role also require you to help staff with administrative tasks including answering the phone, photocopying, and sending letters.

# **Roles in Kirklees**



#### **Work Coach**

Work Coaches give advice and support with finding jobs. You will help to improve and develop a person's strengths and weaknesses to help them become job ready. The role involves working one-to-one with the people to find suitable job opportunities based on the person's skills, interests, experience, and qualifications.

## Befriender

The Befriender role involves giving support and companionship to people who are socially isolated or experiencing mental health challenges. Befrienders are matched with people in our scheme based on your interests and experiences. You will arrange to meet up with the person you are matched with once-a-week. This may include trips to the park, cinema or telephone conversations. As a Befriender you will need to be a good listener and communicator, friendly, approachable, empathetic, and non-judgemental.

# **Activities Support and Administrative Assistant**

The role involves providing administration support for Horton's Substance, Tenancy and Resettlement Service (STARS). You will also help staff to facilitate group activities and the occasional day trip out with people in the scheme.

# **Roles in Calderdale**

# **Early Intervention and Prevention Assistant**

You will call people who have been referred to our Young Persons' Prevention and Support Service (YPASS) and offer support to them as they wait to be allocated a support worker. YPASS supports people who are aged between 16 and 25, and are experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness.

You will be a listening ear to the young person being referred and encourage the people we support to attend activities held at the scheme. The role also involves uploading referrals to a secure online database, logging notes and completing forms.
